




Expected Versus Actual Growth


2022-2023 National Lexile Study – ELL & SPED

Expected Versus Actual Growth by English Learners and Students Receiving Special Education Services





Elkonin Boxes

Provide students with Elkonin boxes and tiles, tokens, pom-poms, or chips. Say a word slowly aloud and have students repeat the word. Then, have students identify the individual sounds in the word. Prompt students to move a tile, token, pom-pom, or chip into a box to represent each sound in the word.

Remember, the number of sounds in a word does not always represent the same number of letters in a word.
